The Australia-China Digital BRIDGE Program is a collaborative, international, professional learning partnership program for educators across Australia and China. The program is an initiative funded by the National Foundation for Australia-China Relations and implemented by the Asia Education Foundation at Asialink, University of Melbourne.

Digital-BRIDGE is a series of expert-led, online, collaborative, professional learning sessions. Participating teachers will build professional knowledge and skills in a range of areas including, digital pedagogies, digital teaching and learning tools, intercultural understanding, Asia and Australia engagement and global competencies. Participants will develop and strengthen a sustainable informal school partnership between their Australian school and a partner school in China and design a collaborative, interdisciplinary, student learning initiative between their schools.

This experience promotes cultural exchange, builds participants' own intercultural understanding and establishes international collaboration between schools, teachers and students on issues of shared global importance.

DIGITAL BRIDGE:

- Builds teachers' capability to develop authentic digital and intercultural learning experiences for students.
- Supports teachers to explore new pedagogies and use technologies to open their classrooms to promote global citizenship and competence.
- Supports teachers to design engaging, online learning experiences.
- Supports students to collaborate on learning engagements, build their global competence and develop international relationships.
- Supports people-to-people links between Australia and China.
- A total of 20 hours AITSL aligned professional learning with evidence of completion.

PROGRAM STRUCTURE

Digital BRIDGE will be delivered in two cohorts: cohort one in October to December 2022 and cohort two in February to May 2023.

In 2022 (cohort 1), 20 Australian schools and 20 schools from across China (including Primary, Junior Secondary and Senior Secondary Schools) will be selected to participate. Participating schools can allocate one (1) to two (2) teachers to participate in the professional learning program.

This program will total 20 hours of professional learning and aligns to the AITSL standards. Participants will be provided with evidence of program completion for their records.

Chinese language ability is not a requirement for Australian teachers to take part in this program, although it can offer added learning outcomes. However, sound English capability is required by Chinese teachers to participate in the program.

The professional learning program includes:

- Eight x 90-minute online workshops
- One online half-day ‘design sprint’ designing a collaborative student learning initiative focused on the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals
- A whole-school engagement approach incorporating; a school leaders round table, teacher professional learning program and a student challenge
- A collaborative school partnership student initiative
- Design thinking methodologies, digital pedagogies and inquiry learning approaches
- Intercultural Learning frameworks, Global Citizenship frameworks and Global Competence frameworks

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

To be eligible to take part in the Australia-China Digital BRIDGE Program, an Australian school must:

- Agree to the conditions of participation and be interested in collaborating and partnering with a school in China.
- Have suitable hardware, software, internet access and IT support.
- Commit to working collaboratively with their Chinese partner school during the program.
- Commit to attending the online sessions
- Have approval and supporting evidence from the school principal to participate in the program.
- Be able to nominate one to two teachers to participate in the program.
- Teachers can be from any discipline, sector, region and experience level.
- Chinese language ability is not a requirement of participation or eligibility. Where two teachers from one school will participate it would be advantageous if one teacher had a level of proficiency. Please note this is not a determining factor of eligibility.

To be eligible, a nominated teacher must:

- Be a classroom or subject teacher working directly with classes of students (the principal and vice principal cannot be nominated).
- Have a proficient level of digital literacy and computer skills
- Be able to participate in eight 90-minute online workshops and a 3.5 hour design sprint over October-November 2022 or early 2023 for Cohort 2.

AITSL STANDARDS

FUNDED PLACES

Successful Australian and Chinese applicants who are selected to participate (teachers and schools) will be financially supported to participate in the Australia-China Digital BRIDGE Program through financial support from the National Foundation of Australia-China Relations in Australia (NFACR). This includes:

- Funding to support the costs of participation in the online Professional Learning Program, including design sprint.
- Ongoing support in relation to professional learning in Australia and China.
